MEDICAL RECORDS (530)

530-152. RHIT Credential Exam Prep. (1 Credit)

This course is designed to assist learners with preparing for the national RHIT certification offered by AHIMA (American Health Information Management Association). The activities emphasize the recall and application of content from each of the current RHIT certification domains. Additionally, learners prepare for the exam through self-assessment and development of an individual exam study plan. Prerequisites: 530-198 (may be taken concurrently) with a minimum grade of C

530-159. Healthcare Revenue Management. (3 Credits)

Learn to compare and contrast healthcare payers, illustrate the reimbursement cycle and comply with regulations related to fraud and abuse. Assign payment classifications with entry-level proficiency using computerized encoding and grouping software.

Prerequisites: 530-184 with a minimum grade of C and 530-197 with a minimum grade of C and 530-199 with a minimum grade of C and 530-162 (may be taken concurrently) with a minimum grade of C See sections of this course (http://www.wctc.edu/academics/programs-courses/course-search/course-search-listing.php?code=530&num=159)

530-161. Health Quality Management. (3 Credits)

Explores the programs and processes used to manage and improve healthcare quality. Addresses regulatory requirements as related to performance measurement, assessment, and improvement, required monitoring activities, risk management and patient safety, utilization management, and medical staff credentialing. Emphasizes the use of critical thinking and data analysis skills in the management and reporting of data.

530-162. Foundations of HIM. (3 Credits)

Introduces learners to the healthcare delivery system, and the external forces that influence healthcare delivery. Sets an understanding for the expectations and standards related to professional ethics, confidentiality and security of health information. Differentiates the use and structure of healthcare data elements, data standards, and the relationships between them. Prepares learners to collect and maintain health data to ensure a complete and accurate health record.

Prerequisites: (501-307 (may be taken concurrently) with a minimum grade of C or 501-107 (may be taken concurrently) with a minimum grade of C)

530-163. Healthcare Stats and Analytics. (3 Credits)

Explore the management of medical data for statistical purposes, focusing on descriptive and inferential statistics including definition, collection, calculation and compilation of numerical data. Examine data analytics, retrieval, presentation and research methodologies.

Prerequisites: 530-162 with a minimum grade of C and 530-165 (may be taken concurrently) with a minimum grade of C and 801-197 (may be taken concurrently) with a minimum grade of C

530-164. Intro to Health Informatics. (3 Credits)

Emphasizes the role of information technology in healthcare through an investigation of the electronic health record (EHR), business, and health information software applications. Learners will develop skills to assist in enterprise information management and database architecture design and implementation.

530-165. Intermediate Coding. (3 Credits)

Prepares students to assign ICD and CPT/HCPCS codes supported by medical documentation and official coding guidance to support appropriate reimbursement. Students will participate in CDI activities, including preparation of appropriate physician queries in accordance with compliance guidelines.

530-166. HIT Capstone. (1 Credit)

Explore technical skills and professional attributes desired for the HIM profession, and conduct activities to assess one's own readiness to enter the health information industry.

530-167. Management of HIM Resources. (3 Credits)

Examines the principles of management to include planning, organizing, human resource management, directing, and controlling as related to the health information department.

530-177. Healthcare Stats & Research. (2 Credits)

Explore the management of medical data for statistical purposes. Focus on descriptive statistics including definitions, collection, calculation, compilation and display of numerical data. Vital statistics, registries and research are examined.

530-178. Healthcare Law & Ethics. (2 Credits)

Examine regulations for the content, use, confidentiality, disclosure and retention of health information. Get an overview of the legal system and ethical issues.

530-182. Human Diseases for Hlth Profes. (3 Credits)

Become familiar with the common diseases encountered in all types of healthcare settings by health information professionals. Examine the causes, signs and symptoms, diagnostic tests and treatment of each disease.

530-184. CPT Coding. (3 Credits)

Learn how to assign Current Procedural Terminology – CPT codes – supported by medical documentation, with entry-level proficiency. Apply CPT instructional notations, conventions, rules and official coding guidelines when assigning CPT codes to case studies and actual medical record documentation.

530-196. Professional Practice. (3 Credits)

530-197. ICD Diagnosis Coding. (3 Credits)
